

Reason For Selection	These are prototypes for functional testing—nicknamed Atsuko and Omoko— built by Casio Computer in 1995 when Casio was developing their first digital cameras equipped with LCD viewfinders. Atsuko tended to overheat, so a tiny fan was installed in the viewfinder compartment, and an LCD screen was substituted for the through-the-lens viewfinder. This is the origin of the LCD viewfinder used on most point-and-shoot digital cameras today. The nickname Omoko refers to the camera's additional weight (omo means heavy) as a result of using generic parts in the camera. Both prototypes date back to the very beginning of digital cameras. Omoko weighed 2.75 kilograms, and Atsuko reached temperatures of 90°C when
