Reason For Selection	Two business-use predecessors to the present-day mobile telephones. (1) The Shoulderphone 100 was a 3kg portable telephone carried by shoulder strap, developed from a car telephone. As a car telephone, it had antennas and batteries built into a wireless device stored in the trunk, while the use of a transceiver made it possible to make calls while outside of the car. This telephone allowed 40 minutes of call time and around 8 hours of standby. (2) The TZ-802B was developed as a portable telephone from the outset, weighing only around 900g. It was Japan's first mobile telephone, offering around 60 minutes of call time and around 6 hours of standby. Both were released by NTT.
