Reason For Selection	It was the world's first plain paper photocopier that achieved minimum size and weight (at the time) by using a cartridge system. By housing all the main components of the photocopier—the photosensitive drum, primary charger, developer, and cleaner—in a compact cartridge, the company succeeded in significantly reducing the size and weight of the photocopier. In addition, the new approach of having users themselves replace cartridges virtually eliminated the need for on-site maintenance and inspection services. The Mini Copier is historically and socially significant in that the advent of mini copiers made it possible not only for government offices and large corporations, but also for private stores and freelance workers to own a photocopier.
