Reason For Selection	This electric bicycle was developed after Konosuke Matsushita, the founder of Matsushita Electric Industrial (now Panasonic), ordered his company to make a bicycle worthy of an electric manufacturer in 1976, ahead of the 60th anniversary of its founding. Sold in limited release in 1980, the bicycle was first launched in Osaka, Nara, and Wakayama from January, and then later in Tokyo and Nagoya from May. Since it can be self-propelled by a motor, it was classified as a type 1 moped that requires a driver's license, so sales were limited. It is significant in that it was the precursor of the subsequent electrically power assisted bicycles as the industry's first commercialized electric bicycle.
