Reason For Selection	Arukuru sembaiho ('the Act Establishing a State Monopoly on Ethanol') and Kihatsuyu oyobi arukoru konyoho ('the Act on Volatile Oils and Ethanol Blending') were established in 1937 to secure gasoline-alternative fuels and to develop rural areas, and state-operated alcohol production factories were built in many areas. The resources are a tray used in the ethanol slurry distillation column, an apparatus for crude distillation of fermented mash made from ingredients such as sweet potatoes (photo 1) and a tray used in the rectification column for alcohol concentration (photo 2). These two pieces have remained. The shape of the former is designed to prevent clogging by fibers of sweet potato and other ingredients. The increased alcohol production volume became raw ingredients for ethylene, ethylene glycol, polyethylene, and other chemical industrial products. This resource is valuable in exhibiting the history of industry in Japan.
