Reason For Selection	The tape recorder, which followed on from the open-reel machines, was accompanied by an ongoing series of developments to not only improve performance, but also to make it smaller and easier to use. The emergence around the mid-1960s of a new magnetic tape called the compact cassette triggered greater advances in reducing the size of these machines. This device, with a built-in microphone necessary for recording, was developed as a small-scale tape recorder to be operated with one hand. This model played to the strengths of the compact cassette, serving as a starting point for later miniaturization and personalization of audio devices.
