| Reason For Selection | In an era of uncertainty about the safety of enzymes when many rival firms withdrew their enzymatic detergents from the market, this product was the first to be deemed completely safe and fully accepted on the market. The phosphate used in synthetic detergents was cited as one of the factors in the eutrophication of lakes and reservoirs and other problematic environmental effects caused by domestic wastewater. Phosphate was an important ingredient for the cleaning efficacy of the detergent, so the challenge was to produce a synthetic detergent that contained little to no phosphate. This product successfully compensated for the reduced cleaning efficacy due to the lower phosphate content by adding in granular capsulized enzymes that would be harmless during manufacture and use. This is a valuable item that represents an important step in the development of synthetic detergents. | |
