It was used in VTRs, which work with video signals, as it could handle a far higher volume of digital information compared to analog. This device was used in connection with the household VTR "Betamax". For the first time in the world, the dream of digital recording could come true in the home, making this a valuable demonstration piece of the originality of Japanese science and technology developments.
