Reason For Selection	This is the first over-the-shoulder tape recorder to be produced in Japan. Weighing 8 kg and measuring 17 cm high \times 35 cm wide \times 17 cm long, it was widely used as a portable tape recorder for on-the-street interviews. It was driven by a hand-wound spring motor and had a tube amplifier. While it was simple, with only one recording/playback head dedicated to recording, the specifications focused on reliability. It was given the pet name "Densuke" after a recording device depicted in the manga of the same name.
