It came in a modular system comprising an integrated Z80-compatible µPD780C CPU, ROM built into the N-BASIC basic software from Microsoft and a standard Microsoft keyboard, plus the capability to add a CRT display, printer, cassette tape recorder for data recording, mini floppy disc, modem and other I/O devices. It was widely used for personal and also business applications due to its color display, capacity to handle kana characters, its moderate price (168,000 yen) and other such factors. A lot of compatible commercial software was also released, which had a major impact on later development of the PC.
