Reason For Selection	This is Japan's first pulsator-type electric washing machine. It could wash in a shorter time than the conventional agitator washing machines and was also suited to Japan's smaller living spaces as it was smaller and lighter. Furthermore, at ¥28,500, it was around half the price of the agitator washing machines, turning the washing machine into a commodity that was affordable to the general public. This triggered the widespread popularization of washing machines and many other household appliances. Reviewer Souichi Ooya dubbed the year this went on sale as "Year 1 of the Age of Electrification". The popularization of washing machines drastically reduced the amount of housework needing to be done by homemakers, thereby boosting the social advancement of women.
