Reason For Selection	The world's first digital facsimile for general business use that directly connected to a public telephone line. Those days, analog systems connecting to telephone lines by acoustic coupling was in use. This was an epoch-making device which has capable of transmitting a standard document in just one minute, six times faster than the conventional system, by digitally processing document reading, data processing and all system control processes. This triggered the digitization of the facsimile due to the speed and stability of the transmission.
